Change of timings for September **2021**



RECEPTION TO YEAR 6

From September, the start and end times of our school day will resume to what they were, prior Pandemic.

There will be a soft start at the beginning of the school day where children will make their way to their classes from **8.45am.** Entrances will be via the Old Pedestrian Gate in Main Avenue and the green gate in Ermine Side. All children must be in class by 8.55am.

The end of the school day will be **3.15pm** where children will be collected from the North Playground. Class teachers will bring pupils out and parents will collect from each class' muster points which are clearly labelled in the playground.

CHILDREN SHOULD CONTINUE TO

... BRING WATER BOTTLES TO SCHOOL

All children MUST bring a named water bottle in each day as the water fountains in the playgrounds and across the school will be out of use.

... BRING OWN PERSONAL RESOURCES TO SCHOOL

All children must bring a pencil case to school consisting of pencils, black and blue biros, ruler, rubber and a pencil sharpener.

... COME TO SCHOOL IN PE KITS ON ALLOCATED PE DAYS

COVID-19 Vaccine

Below is some information about how to get the COVID-19 vaccine in Barnet, Camden, Enfield, Haringey and Islington.

All adults aged 18 or over can now get a COVID-19 vaccine. You do not need to be a UK citizen or permanent resident – anybody aged 18 or over in the UK is eligible for the COVID-19 vaccination for free, regardless of their nationality or immigration status. The COVID-19 vaccine is the best way to protect yourself, friends and family from the virus.

To book an appointment, go to: <u>www.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination</u> or call 119 free of charge, 7am-11pm, 7 days a week.

Appointments are no longer needed at many vaccination centres – $\frac{\text{find out more here}}{\text{find out more here}}$ about walk-in centres in Barnet, Camden, Enfield, Haringey and Islington. Follow the North Central London NHS on <u>Twitter</u> and <u>Facebook</u> for latest information about where to get the jab.

Some 16 and 17 year olds are also eligible for the vaccine (e.g. health and social care workers and those who are clinically extremely vulnerable). Under 18s will need to speak to their GP to confirm their eligibility and organise a vaccination appointment. Many people have questions about the vaccines. For trustworthy information to help you decide whether to have the vaccine, you can find answers to lots of questions on the <u>NHS website</u> and from the <u>Department of Health and Social Care</u>. The <u>Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists</u> has information and videos about the vaccine and pregnancy and fertility. If you have more questions, when you arrive for your appointment at a vaccination centre, you will be able to have a private consultation with a trusted, healthcare professional. You can discuss with them any concerns you have about the vaccine, its safety or whether it is suitable for you and your individual circumstances. You are not under any obligation to be vaccinated following this conversation if you would prefer not to.

A year on from our first national lockdown, we understand that many families may be facing financial difficulty, either due to historic debts or that they may be accumulating debts.

Understanding that this is a continued area of concern in our local community, we would like to remind you of the **free debt advice** we offer - supported by Community Money Advice, as well as being authorised and regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA).

Enfield Debt Centre is run in conjunction with North Enfield Foodbank. The centre is conveniently located at the same premises as our Foodbank, at Jubilee Central, 2 Lumina Way, Enfield EN1 1FS.

Open on **Tuesdays**, **Thursdays** and **Saturdays** from **11am-3pm** (the same times as our Foodbank), the centre offers support and advice, helping people to arrange payment plans with creditors and to manage their personal finances through budgeting. People can also be signposted to relevant organisations.


