

We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Arbor App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Arbor App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).


How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday

Some tips to try

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor. Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- 4. Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.

APPLYING FOR A PLACE IN A NURSERY CLASS

September 2023

If your child is born between 1.9.19 and 31.8.20 you need to think about applying for a place in a nursery class for September 2023. The places in most schools are part time, either mornings or afternoons. Some schools also offer 30 hours placements, if you qualify for a 30 hr placement you can find out from schools directly if they offer this opportunity.

Please remember that admission to a nursery class will not guarantee a place in the reception class in September 2024.

APPLYING FOR A PLACE IN A RECEPTION CLASS

Applying for a place in a reception class If your child was born between 1.9.18 and 31.8.19 you need to think about applying for a place in reception class for September 2023.

The information booklet 'Applying for a Primary School in Enfield. Information for Parents' is available online for all families at www.enfield.gov.uk/admissions.

If your child has an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP), SEN Services will contact you to explain the process you will need to follow as the arrangements for your child will be different. For more information contact SEN@enfield.gov.uk.

Online Applications

Parents need to make an online application for a school place. You can apply online at www.eadmissions.org.uk. You can do this from 1 September 2022 through to 15 January 2023. You can make changes to your preferences throughout the application period but make sure you follow the instructions to resubmit any amendments made.

How the system works

- You can apply for up to 6 schools
- You make an application to the local authority in which you live
- You can apply for schools in Enfield or elsewhere
- A computer system is used to exchange information about Enfield residents applying for schools outside the borough. Other boroughs tell us about their residents applying for Enfield schools.

How to Apply

- You will apply online at www. eadmissions.org.uk. We suggest you register your details as early as possible. You can submit your application once you have had the opportunity to learn more about the schools. The closing date is 15 January 2023.
- If you are applying for a school that requires you to complete a supplementary information form these must be returned to the school directly by the specified date. The Enfield schools that require a supplementary form are voluntary aided faith schools. Check the school website for information about the admissions criteria

How offers will be

- All the preferences (schools) listed will be considered by the relevant admissions authority.
- If the number of applications received for a school exceeds the number of available places, the oversubscription criteria (rules) will be used to decide which children are eligible to be offered a place.
- If your child could be offered a place at more than one school, we will look to see which school you have listed as your higher preference and this place will be offered.

- If a school has more applications than places, the published admission criteria is used to decide who should be offered a place.
- No child is offered more than one school place.
- You will get the results of your application during the evening of 17 April 2023.

Choosing a school

- Please do some research, look at school's website, Ofsted reports and read the school prospectus.
- Consider how you will get your child to school.
- Don't listen to gossip, what's right for other children may not be the same for your child.
- Think about how realistic your choice is, most schools get more applications than they have places available.



- All lower preferences are then withdrawn.
- Your child will still be considered for any schools that you listed as a higher preference.
- All online applicants will receive an email during the evening of 17 April 2023.
- Most parents will be offered a place at a school they are happy with. However, this is not always the case and some families are disappointed with the outcome of their application. If this is the case, further information will be sent to you in April.

It is important that you understand the way in which places are allocated. If you have any queries, please either:

- Talk to your child's nursery;
- Read the Primary information booklet which will be available on the Council's website.

WHAT TO EXPECT?

We only expect your child to participate 30% in their first session, it takes 3 to 6 weeks for a child to fully settle and get into the swing of the lesson plans with the coaches. So don't worry if they struggle with attention or get a little shy – our coaches will help them through the lesson and look after them.



WHO IS COACHING MY CHILD?



Our experienced S4K coaches are overseen by Alison, who has been a teacher for 20 years, as well as having 17 years' experience working in a specialist respite centre for children with severe, multiple and profound SEND. The coaches are also trained by Jeddiah, who has 16 years' experience teaching primary aged children, along with being a deputy head teacher with experience working in a mainstream school helping children with varying needs.

WHAT WILL MY CHILD LEARN?

The lesson plans are based upon a monthly theme with a main skill of the month to be practiced at home. Each week the coach teaches progressions for each skill which you will mirror at home with your child.

The STARS project encourages active, healthy, safe and sustainable travel. We aim to reduce the number of car journeys to our school to improve congestion, pollution and to make the roads safer for our children. Walking, scooting or cycling for all or part of the way to school is a great way to fit in exercise for children at the start of the day. The green cross code

- 1. Find a safe place to cross then stop
- 2. Stand on the pavement not the ker
- 3. Look all around for traffic and listen
- If traffic is coming, let it pass, look all round again
- 5. When there is no traffic walk carefully across the road

If we all try to make more trips by walking and cycling, we can reduce traffic on our streets, improve the air quality and our health and wellbeing.

Use our Walking, Cycling, Wheeling map to help plan your active travel route to school, discover new, quieter streets, and perhaps meet a friend on the way.

If you need to drive, park 10 minutes away from the school. Walking the rest of the way will help achieve your daily active mile, reduce the number of cars outside the school and help keep children safe.

Did you know?

- ▶ 69% of Enfield's pupils live within 1 mile of their school!
- It only takes 20 minutes to walk 1 mile, or 6 minutes to cycle!
- You are exposed to cleaner air when walking and cycling compared to when riding in a car!

Why Active Travel?

Actively travelling to school is more fun than riding in a car, it helps you reach your daily exercise goal of 60 minutes and helps you concentrate better at school. Walking, scooting or cycling your journey also improves your road safety awareness, and helps you become confident to travel independently.

The **4-7s website** from CEOP Education supports you to equip your child with the knowledge, skills and confidence to stay safer online.

About the 4-7s website

The new 4-7s website is designed around the three-episode <u>Jessie & Friends</u> animated series. Jessie & Friends follows the adventures of Jessie, Tia and Mo as they begin to navigate the online world.

The website provides the building blocks of understanding and resilience to help protect children from dangers they might encounter while watching videos, sharing pictures, playing games and chatting online.

It's never too early to talk to your child about what they do online and who to tell if they come across anything online that makes them feel worried, scared or sad.

The website is divided into age sections for 4-5 and 6-7 year olds and features educational, online safety badge games. The badge games replicate various online situations to help children recognise when something isn't right and reinforce the key message that they should Tell A Grown Up (TAG) when something happens online that makes them feel worried, scared or sad.

The website is intended to be used by 4-7 year olds alongside their parents and carers. By helping your child to understand and identify what the dangers are online, you help to prevent potential harms.

How to use the website with children

4-7 year olds should always be supervised by an appropriate adult while they are using a device or playing online. The 4-7s website is designed to help you and your child learn and explore online safety topics together.

Tips for getting started

- 1 Introduce Jessie, Tia and Mo and pick a badge to play.
- Play the badge(s) answer questions to help Jessie, Tia and Mo know when to tell an adult they trust about something that has happened online.
- Collect 3 stars to complete the badge. Download the certificate to keep or print and colour in, and choose which badge to play next!

The Badges



Watching Videos (4-5 and 6-7 year olds)

The Watching Videos badge asks players to identify whether Jessie is feeling 'Ok' while watching videos on her tablet or whether to TAG. This helps your child to know when to tell a grown up about something they have watched online that has made them feel worried, scared or sad.

Conversation starter: Ask your child what things might show how Jessie is feeling (for example, crying or laughing).

What next? Watch Jessie & Friends Episode 1 - Watching Videos.

Sharing Pictures (6-7 year olds)

The Sharing Pictures badge asks players to decide whether Tia should TAG or 'reply' to the pictures she has been sent online. This is to help your child recognise when they should tell a trusted adult about something that has been shared with them that worried, scared or upset them.



Conversation Starter: Ask your child how each of the pictures make them feel and why some pictures would be ok to reply to but others are not (for example, explain that sharing pictures of someone without their permission is not ok).

What next? Watch Jessie & Friends Episode 2 - Sharing Pictures.



Online Gaming (6-7 year olds)

The Online Gaming badge asks players to decide which messages the characters should reply to in an adventure game. This helps your child understand when is appropriate to respond to other users in an online game and when they should TAG.

Conversation starter: Talk about how people can pretend to be friendly online to trick young people into doing something (for example, saying they will help you win the game if you give them your password).

Chatting Online (6-7 year olds)


The Chatting Online badge asks players to choose which of the online messages that Mo has received he should TAG about. This is to help your child identify potentially inappropriate messages online and when they should tell a trusted adult about what they have received.
