Starting School

- ▶ 2 classes - Crimson, Ruby, (Scarlet)
 - ▶ 30 children in each class
- ▶ Play and Stay sessions - Dates in Admission pack
- ▶ Home visit if your child has not attended Nursery- Date in Admission pack
 - ▶ School day: 8.50am - 3.15pm

Staggered Entry

- ▶ **Wednesday 5th September and Thursday 6th September** - 8.50am - 12.00pm. Children will be collected from their classrooms before lunchtime.
- ▶ **Friday 7th September - Tuesday 11th September** - 8.50am - 1.00pm - parents are invited to come into school and enjoy lunch time with their child. Lunch is at 11.50pm
- ▶ **Wednesday 12th September and Thursday 13th September** - 8.50am - 1.00pm - the children will stay for lunch on their own but need to be collected at 1.00pm
- ▶ **Friday 14th September** - 8.50 - 3.15 the children will be in all day.
- ▶ Should your child find the full day too difficult by the 13th September, they will continue coming in for half a day

Uniform

- ▶ Grey school trousers or skirt or pinafore
- ▶ Green and white school dress.
- ▶ Black trainers or sensible school shoes.

School sweatshirts, cardigans and PE kits can be ordered. Please collect forms from the office.

PE Kit

- ▶ PE once a week
- ▶ Reception children will need a PE kit
 - White school T-shirt
 - Green shorts
 - Plimsolls
- ▶ Kept in school and labelled

Staying for lunch

- ▶ Reception will stay for lunch from **Friday 7th September**. We invite parents/carers to join their children in the lunch hall from 12pm for the first 3 days.
- ▶ Children may have a school dinner or a pack lunch.
- ▶ Those on income support may qualify for free school meals, however all children under 7 currently receive a free lunch.
- ▶ Pack lunches should consist of a healthy lunch
- ▶ They should not contain any nut products, meat on the bone, fizzy drinks, sweets or chocolate.
- ▶ One weeks notice to change between dinners & pack lunches

Early Years Curriculum

- ▶ There are 3 Characteristics of Learning
 - **Playing and Exploring**
 - **Active Learning**
 - **Creating and Thinking Critically**
- ▶ Children will use the indoor and outdoor environment every day


Learning Book

- ▶ Children are assessed through observations
- ▶ Secure tablets used by staff
- ▶ Logins can be created for parents if an email address is provided
- ▶ Access enables parents to see photos or videos of their children's learning
- ▶ Parents can add photos or comments on children's work

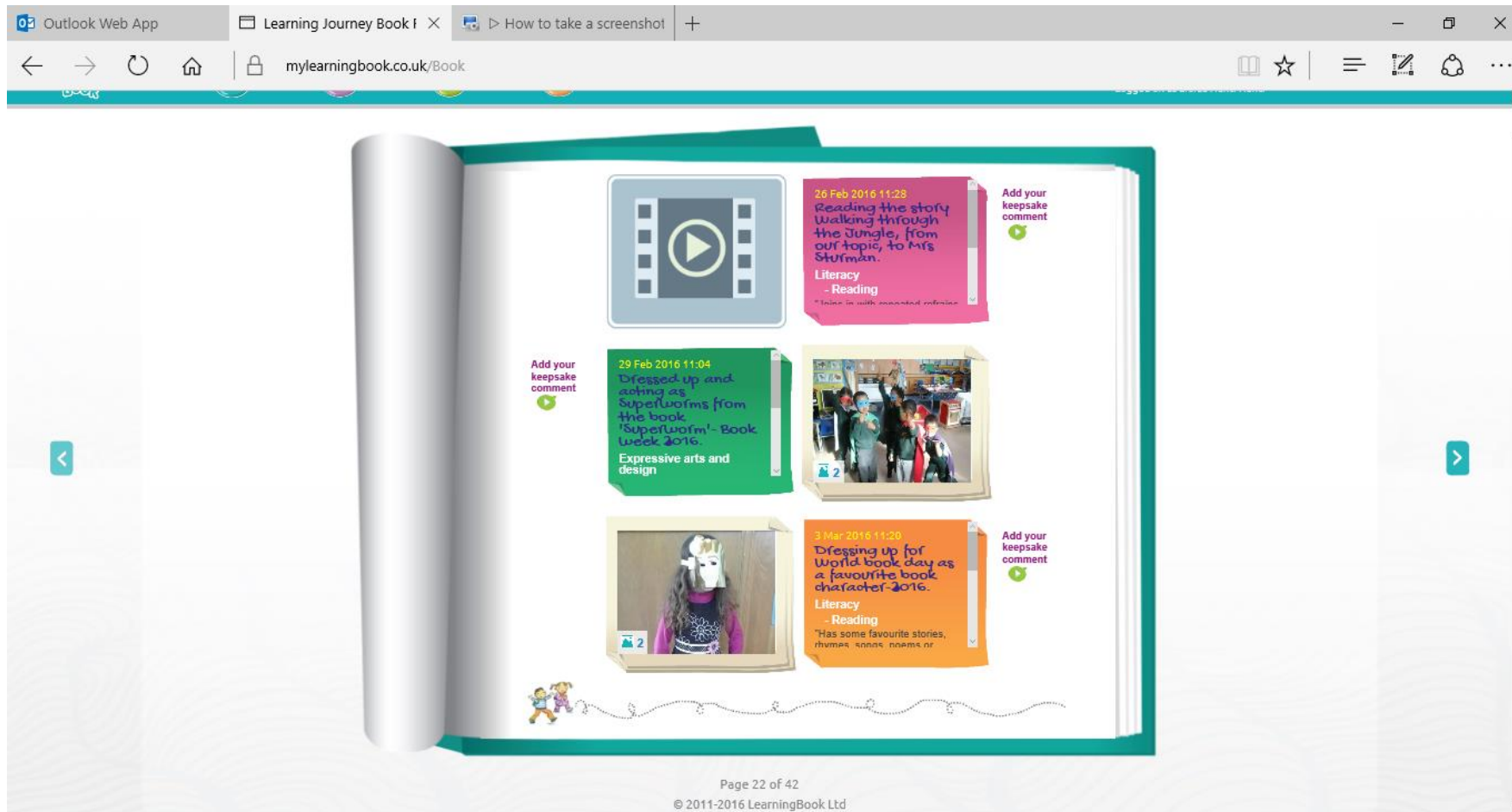

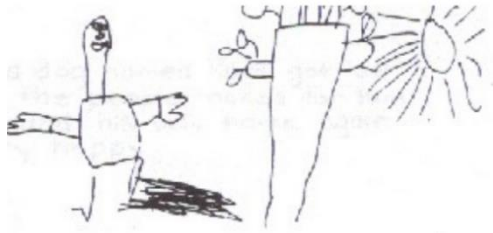
Learning in the EYFS





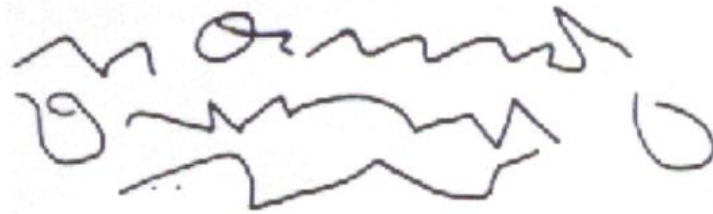
- ▶ Developing a love of reading is central to our reading strategy in Early Years. Our aim is to get children reading fluently as quickly as possible.
- ▶ Daily phonics and reading program
- ▶ Learning at their pace
- ▶ Daily Supported Reading runs alongside Read Write Inc. Children read in groups with an adult with every day.

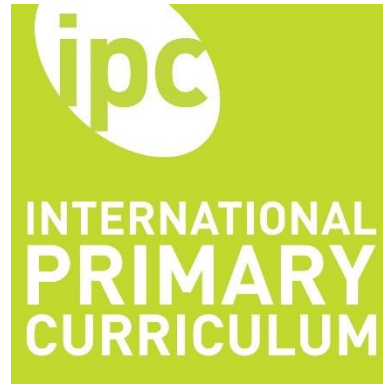

4. Phonetic spelling and first letters



- ▶ Early numeracy skills are taught daily in Reception.
- ▶ Mathematics Mastery is proven method of teaching maths skills by developing depth of understanding. It has three strands:
 - Objects, Pictures, Numbers and Signs - children understand that numbers and signs represent pictures and objects
 - Mathematical language - children use the correct vocabulary and understand what it means
 - Problem Solving - Children use problem solving to develop their mathematical skills. Children use problem solving at every lesson.



- ▶ IPC is used in 1,800 schools in 90 countries
- ▶ Children study a new topic every half term
- ▶ Children learn about their topic through practical activities including cooking activities

- ▶ Weekly reading book - please ensure your child's books are kept in their bag and their reading record is kept up to date
- ▶ Read Write Inc Homework
- ▶ Numeracy
- ▶ Topic Homework where relevant
